Panel members from the US and Cuba addressed issues of LGBT rights in Cuba, and the US Women and Cuba Collaboration's work on their US and Cuban Lesbians and Allies project. Collaboration presented a workshop at INCITE! Color Of Violence 4 Conference, "Beyond the State: Inciting Transformative Possibilities." The workshop looked at how the Cuban

revolution has addressed the human rights of the Cuban people as well as people internationally by providing doctors, medical personnel and teachers throughout the world, focusing on the advancement of a women's rights agenda under the Cuban revolution. In particular it discussed campaigns in Cuba that are addressing the struggles against homophobia, racism and domestic violence and their relationship to building a more inclusive society under the Cuban revolution, including the screening of the Cuban documentary on lesbians claiming their identities, *Between Heaven and Earth*. August 28-September 11

Organized a custom coed delegation, "The Cuban Revolution: Its History and Present Day Transformation." After a few days in Havana, the delegation will proceed east, stopping at historical sites and meeting with people and organizations in Cienfuegos, Trinidad, Camaguey, Bayamo, Santo Domingo/Sierra Maestra, Baracoa and Santiago, while studying the history of the Cuban revolution and the current social and economic transformations occurring in Cuba now.

November 13-22

Organized a 20 member US women's delegation, "Advancing Women's Human Rights, Racial Justice and Community Development in Cuba," traveling under a people-to-people license. Spending significant time in both Havana and Santiago, this delegation got an early look at how women and all Cubans are experiencing the impacts of recent changes to Cuban-US diplomatic relations. Included site visits to agricultural cooperatives, community development projects, Cuba's National Center for Sex Education, schools for social work and arts education, and childcare centers and maternity homes, and featured an Encuentro on "Preventing and Addressing Gender-Based Violence" at which US and Cuban women built partnerships and exchanged local and global strategies.
